From the secretary:-

We are coming up to a busy time of the year for the Society in what has been an eventful year. On 30th August our Chair, Liz Wilkinson, and I fly out to Denmark to represent the Society at the bi-annual World Galloway Conference. This is an important occasion for meeting our colleagues abroad and will provide an opportunity to visit herds in Denmark and see how the breed is progressing elsewhere. Next month sees the A.G.M. and sale at Castle Douglas, which are mentioned in this newsletter, and we shall also be asking for material for inclusion in next year's Annual News. SHOW ROUNDUP

Congratulations are due to Society Vice Chairman John Corrie, whose bull Park Perseus not only took the honours at the Royal Highland Show, but also triumphed at Stranraer and was reserve champion at Wigtown. A creditable performance all round.

Perseus faced some stiff competition, however, from Mochrum Lila, David Bertie's cow, which took the champion's rosette at Wigtown and the reserve champion at Stranraer. The Mochrum herd was on form again at Straiton, where their heifer Mochrum Kestie 2nd pipped Jane Landers' junior heifer Whitepool Melody. Meanwhile, a good turnout of Belties impressed a large crowd around the ring at the Great Yorkshire Show. Mochrum Kestie 2nd again prevailed, taking the champion's position in front of Sir Martin Arbib's bull Howemill See the Sky, which took the reserve championship.

WEBSITE READY SOON

After a long wait the Society's new website is nearing completion, with Galloway based designers www.purplethistlepr.co.uk making good progress with the content and structure. It is hoped the site will be live around mid-September, and, as well as the usual background information about the breed and its history, the site should provide members with a useful tool for interacting with the Society. Members will be able to advertise on the site, download forms for registering animals and other activities, and, eventually will be able to access the data the Society uses in the Grassroots programme for information about cattle. This will ultimately lead to online registrations with no paperwork at all, a prospect welcomed by many members.

ADVERTS REQUIRED

It was clear from the old website that its most popular function was advertising cattle for sale or wanted. The new site will offer an improved facility for this. A prominent link on the front page will lead to the sales/wants section, where an abbreviated list of adverts will appear. Each line in this list will form a link to a full page advert, so people browsing down the list will be able to access any adverts which catch their eye. It will also allow the advertiser to go into much more detail than previously, and will even allow photos of the animals to be displayed. In order to cover the costs of this facility, and to keep the advert section fresh and current, Council has decided that each advert will cost £10 and will be displayed for one month only. The advert will, of course be maintained for a second and subsequent months if the advertiser decides to pay accordingly. In this way out of date adverts will be avoided.

Orders for website adverts are being taken now, so please give the Secretary the details you would like posted, preferably no more than 200 words, together with any photos you would like displayed.

V.A.T.

Just a brief reminder that the Society has now registered for V.A.T. and will begin adding V.A.T. to all its invoices from **1st October 2010**. From this date members who are registered for V.A.T. will be able to claim back the tax. Those who are not will unfortunately face a slight increase in their fees, but this will be balanced by the thousands of pounds the Society will save, which will in turn be used for the members' benefit.

Birth notification

Another reminder that, starting from **1st January 2011**, the Society, in common with many other breeds, will operate a birth notification scheme. This means that every calf of both sexes must be notified to the Society before it is two months old. The fee for birth notification will be £5/head, which will be refunded if the animal is subsequently registered as pedigree. Still births and post-natal deaths should still be notified, but will attract no fee. All members will receive notification forms by the end of this year. You may recall that notification will help with verification for T.B. compensation, upland environmental schemes and direct selling of Beltie beef.

CASTLE DOUGLAS SALE

Walleys Marts will once again host the Society's main annual sale on **Friday 22nd October**, and there will no doubt be another excellent entry. Schedules are available either from the market (Tel. 01556 502381) or from the Secretary. The pre-sale show will take place at 9.30 a.m. All show cattle must be halter led, as must all sale bulls (except dispersals). Vendors wishing to export cattle are reminded to familiarize themselves with export requirements, which can be obtained from the market. Entries must be with the market by **17th September 2010**, but late entries will be accepted until 25th September on payment of a £58.75 per head penalty fee. After that no entries will be accepted. Members are reminded that pedigree certificates must accompany every entry. If any members are waiting for certificates for animals which will be entered in the sale they are urged to contact the secretary immediately and their certificates will be dealt with straightaway.

A.G.M./ANNUAL DINNER

Once again the Annual General meeting of the Society will take place at the Urr Valley Hotel in Castle Douglas at 6.30 p.m. on **Thursday 21st October 2010**, the evening before the annual sale. The meeting will be followed by the annual dinner at 8.00 p.m., and, following the success of last year's event, members are advised to order their tickets as soon as possible after they become available at the end of September.
